Mrs. Strosnider and the Home Ec classes worked together to make cookies for Valentine's Day. They

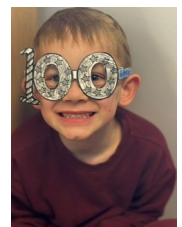
